To our beloved Family, Friends, and Supporters

As Executive Director of Hospice Visions, Inc., I am honored to be a part of such a caring and compassionate team of individuals. What we do for our patients and families is not a job, but an honor that we do not take lightly. It is a responsibility and a privilege to which Hospice Visions, Inc. team members dedicate themselves.

I am very sad to say that one of our team members and well respected registered nurses, Joseph T. Rasch, passed away of natural causes in October of 2017. This was a terrible loss to our team as well as Joe's family. In order to honor him and mourn his loss, we created the Joseph T. Rasch Nursing Scholarship.

This scholarship is available to any United States citizen who is a resident of the state of Idaho and enrolled in a nursing program in Idaho. Our dateline to apply for the scholarship is from March 1st to April 30th, annually. I would like to acknowledge Joe's family, as they played a vital part in assisting us with funding for this scholarship. I am pleased to say that the first recipient of this scholarship was awarded to Charity Clausen, in the summer of 2018. In conjunction with the Joseph T. Rasch Scholarship, we have established an annual Joseph T. Rasch Run/Walk to assist us in the funding of this special nursing scholarship. Our first event was held May 12th of 2018, on Mother's Day! This day turned out very special to Joe's family, and so we have made the decision to hold it every Mother's Day going forward. Our next Run/Walk will be May 11th, 2019. If you would like to join us for this special event, please call the office for more information.

During our fiscal year from August 1st, 2017 through July 31st, 2018, we provided direct patient care to 357 patients and families throughout Gooding, Jerome, Lincoln, and Twin Falls counties. In addition, our bereavement services connected us to 300 individuals and families.

Our compassionate care and specialized patient and family focus could not exist without the generous support of our team, volunteers, Board of Directors, families, friends, and the community as a whole. Thank you for your continued support of Hospice Visions, Inc. 

This ideal is the very reason we currently have 1.29 million active duty personnel in the U.S. Military. Hospice Visions, Inc. has the distinct honor of caring for veterans who served in WWII, Korea, Bay of Pigs, Vietnam, Dominican Republic, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, Gulf War, Somalia, Bosnia, Kosovo, Global War on Terror, Afghanistan, Iraq, and the War Against the Islamic State, who are living with a life limiting disease, illness, or condition. To honor these individuals and all others living in assisted and skilled living centers, we provide each veteran with a specialized door plaque, as an identifier for the passerby, to recognize that an American hero lives in that room (pictured to the left).

Our Veteran-to-Veteran volunteers, Bob and Manny, visit six to fourteen veteran patients and bereaved, each week. Because they speak their own language and have an unspoken brotherhood, this camaraderie can't be achieved by civilians. We are so thankful for Bob and Manny, who have stepped up to serve those who have served in such a deep and meaningful way!

Hospice Visions, Inc. labors to help patients and their families grow personally at end-of-life. The team has had a year filled with fostering wishes of those receiving care from Hospice Visions, Inc. Here are a few:



Hospice Visions, Inc. partnered with Precision Aviation to help a retired Navy Veteran fulfill his wish to go on one last flight. He was able to take a personalized air tour of the Magic Valley with generous donations from our local community, facilitated by the team at Hospice Visions, Inc.



A resident moved to Twin Falls from West Magic Reservoir. The team at Hospice Visions, Inc. saw to her move as well as assisted her in returning to her old home in West Magic to ensure that she was able to spend her final days with her beloved cat, Little Miss. In the spirit of moving, Hospice Visions showed out en masse in order to help a husband and wife move into a local facility on very short notice. We were able to collaborate with our partners at a local self-service truck rental company to facilitate the move.

The tendency to be wistful, especially as the year comes to a close, can be heightened in our hospice patients. One of our hospice families expressed the importance in having a Christmas tree with all of the trimmings put up for their loved one to enjoy. We were able to facilitate a donated tree and decorations for the family to appreciate over their holiday; even their grandchildren and great grandchildren were able to enjoy the tree during their visit.

Home Safe Home



Hospice Visions, Inc. cultivates the well-being and livelihood of the residents of the Magic Valley, regardless of their enrollment in our services. As a result, the Home Safe Home program was developed and is provided at no cost in order to allow professional staff to work along-side our neighbors, especially when lacking the knowledge or resources to help themselves.

Throughout the year, the team at Hospice Visions, Inc. has assisted multiple local citizens in identifying resources for and delivery of medical equipment such as lift chairs, hospital beds, and motorized wheelchairs.

A patient prescribed a rather pricey medication to prevent blood clots contacted Hospice Visions, Inc. and was routed into the Home Safe Home program for help. He had been paying upwards of \$400 monthly. During the assessment and intervention the team was able to assist the patient in having the medication mailed to him for \$9 a month.

Our Home Safe Home team was able to assist a patient living on his own in an isolated area with his medication reconciliation and self-sufficiency. He had been released from a hospital stay with multiple new prescriptions and discontinuation of others. A Registered Nurse and Social Worker were able to visit with him in order to assist him in gaining the confidence to get on track successfully with his medication regime.



People tend to struggle when having conversations with their loved ones, especially the need for additional in-home care or a move to a higher level of care. Through our Home Safe Home program, the social work team at Hospice Visions, Inc. helps our local families engage their loved ones in intermediate and long-term care planning.

23RD Annual Flo Slatter Memorial Golf Tournament






The Quilting Spuds





Hospice Visions, Inc. **Revenue**




Hospice Visions, Inc. **Expenses**




Patients by Diagnoses



Patients by Age



Patients by **Ethnicity**




