To our beloved Family, Friends, and Supporters

Wow what a year – not exactly how I envisioned 2020, but I must say it is flying by! It has definitely been a very busy year. I am happy to report we passed our recertification process with Community Health Accreditation Partner (CHAP) with only 4 tags. Although we are in the midst of a pandemic, we continue providing exemplary care for our current patients and families, while accepting new patients and families, always cognizant of keeping everyone safe.

I am happy to say we had 3 applicants for our Joseph Rasch Scholarship this year. McKenzie Clancy was awarded the Scholarship for 2020. McKenzie is currently an LPN and working her way through the RN Program at the College of Southern Idaho. She is very dedicated and driven as she enters her 3rd semester of nursing school. Congratulations McKenzie. I also want to thank Mike and Marie Rasch for their continued support of this scholarship! We all love and miss our Joe. Our dateline for accepting applications is from March 1st to April 30th, annually.

This year, due to COVID-19, we made the decision to cancel our Annual Joseph T. Rasch Run/Walk that assists us in the funding of this special nursing scholarship. We had initially postponed it to September 12, 2020, but due to the continued pandemic, it was decided to just reschedule it for 2021. He was such a great person and nurse and his memory remains near and dear in our hearts. So, mark your calendars for next year's event, which will be held on June 12, 2021. During our fiscal year from August 1, 2019 through July 31, 2020, we provided direct patient care to 340 patients and families throughout Cassia, Gooding, Jerome, Lincoln, Minidoka, and Twin Falls counties. In addition, our bereavement services connected us to many individuals and families regardless of their affiliation with our services. We continue to offer our "Visions of Hope" grief support group to anyone who is experiencing a loss, while adhering to the CDC guidelines of wearing masks and social distancing. So, if you know of anyone who may benefit from this service, please have them call our office for details.

Our compassionate care and specialized patient and family focus could not exist without the generous support of our team, volunteers, board of directors, families and friends, and the community as a whole. Thank you for your continued support of Hospice Visions, Inc. An estimated 253,220 of the 16 million Americans who served in World War II are living today. Treasures of history are tucked away in communities all around the U.S. Everyone at Hospice Visions, Inc. worked very hard to complete the steps required to achieve our “We Honor Veterans” level five certification.

Giving honor and respect to our communities veterans, whether they are receiving our services or not, has always been a top priority for our organization. We work closely with the VA and all of our local veterans services, to insure that every service man or woman receives the opportunity to register for the benefits they have earned.

To better serve our veterans, we provide era or issue specific veterans trainings to all of our staff and volunteers each year, to keep everyone up to date on specific needs or issues our veterans may face. As an organization we participate in monthly veteran centered meetings as well as participating in veterans events as they occur in our community.

Last year alone, we performed 31 veterans pinning/recognition ceremonies in assisted living centers and private homes. We are fortunate to have four Veteran-to-Veteran volunteers: Levi, Manny, Alan, and Bob, who are available to visit with veterans receiving our hospice care. These specialized volunteers are able to deeply connect with our veteran patients, as they speak the language and share a brotherhood with other veterans in a way that only they can. It's truly a privilege to be able to care for those who ensured our freedom and our way of life here in the United States of America.

6TH Annual Commemorative Vietnam Veterans Welcome Home Event

It was looking doubtful that our 6th Annual Commemorative Vietnam Veterans Welcome Home Event was going to happen in this crazy year of 2020. There was one obstacle after another, right down to the very week of the event.

However, on the morning of July 18th, 2020, in the Twin Falls City Park, the rumbling sounds of motorcycles were heard. Riders were assembling to make their annual pilgrimage through the towns of Kimberly, Hansen, Jerome, and Buhl, to pay their respects to their fallen brothers and sisters at cemeteries, Veterans Memorials, and for the first time in our 6 years, the new National Veterans Cemetery, in Buhl, ID.

Even though we were not able to celebrate with a community BBQ, as we have in past years, the Veterans were able to enjoy their ride, while being escorted by the Twin Falls Police Departments finest officers!



Hospice Visions, Inc. has partnered with the Dream Foundation over the course of many years, in order to offer opportunities to hospice patients and their loved ones in the fulfillment of lifelong wishes. In addition, Hospice Visions, Inc. has recently incorporated the use of a discretionary dream fund to assist our local residents, when joint efforts with the Dream Foundation are not possible. Whether coordinating with community resources or making use of discretionary funds, Hospice Visions, Inc. continues to look for ways to enhance the quality of life of the residents of the Magic Valley and the Mini-Cassia area who are receiving hospice care.

On one occasion, the team at Hospice Visions, Inc. assisted a patient and his spouse in having a celebratory dinner for their anniversary. The patient had experienced a sudden decline and was unable to go out to their favorite restaurant to celebrate as a result. On the eve of their anniversary, they were greeted by their RN with a meal, dessert, a card, and flowers in observation of the importance of this date.

Often, despite significant health limitations, our patients have a desire to travel to destinations that they have neglected for the entirety of their lives. Recently, Hospice Visions, Inc. provided assistance to a patient, his sibling, and a family friend in order to allow them to travel to Yellowstone. The patient has a lifelong love of animals and was delighted to be able to visit the park, the animals, and the scenic attractions. His team also coordinated with the rangers in the park, in order that he be made an honorary ranger. He and his family were touched by the generosity of all involved.

The use of our discretionary fund is not always expressed as a grand gesture. This year, Hospice Visions, Inc. made use of its discretionary fund in order to purchase some noise-cancelling headphones for a patient. His had been damaged beyond repair and he lived in a somewhat hectic environment. He used music to combat the chaos of his situation and was able to be provided a new pair of headphones to allow him to increase his day-to-day quality of life for the better.

Hospice Visions, Inc. worked with the Dream Foundation this year, in order to offer support to a patient who had a desire to travel to the west coast and dip her feet in the ocean, in California. Unfortunately, the patient suffered a quick decline and found herself unable to tolerate transport given symptom management needs. The Dream Foundation was quickly able to modify the dream request to allow her family to fly to her home town, along with a provision for ground transport and lodging, which gave her family an opportunity to see each other in person and share together in stories, laughter, and love.



Senior Liaison Services

Hospice Visions, Inc. is always looking for some way to reach out to those in need of help, often by providing education in different areas of healthcare. At times, seniors have complex medical and/or social issues, where having a professional clinician to consult with is a beneficial resource. The Home-Safe-Home program was designed to help those who are not sure where to get the help they need. A professional social worker does an effective consultation, and then, can provide important information about community resources including: caregiver resources, in-home meals, life line, benefit programs, and support groups. There is no charge for this consultation and in most circumstances, one visit is enough to provide the needed resources and alleviate much stress and worry for all parties involved.

Throughout the year, Hospice Visions, Inc. has been able to assist multiple community members with obtaining and receiving needed equipment for their homes, such as power lift recliners, motorized scooters, and hospital beds.

A gentleman in the area wound up residing in an assisted living facility, due to a chain of hospitalizations and a general decline in health. After some time, he regained his strength and was eager to return to an independent living situation, where he could go about his daily activities as he desired, on his own schedule. Through a Home-Safe-Home consultation with Hospice Visions, Inc., our social worker was able to assist him to find senior housing options that fit into his budget and helped facilitate a successful transition back to his independent lifestyle.

In another instance, an elderly lady was in need of assistance to remain in her home and continue to live independently. She was given information about the Medicaid program and assisted with the navigation through the application process. Through her Home-Safe-Home experience, she was able to line up the assistance she needed with local care agencies, and feels confident that she can remain in her home for the foreseeable future.



Hospice Visions, Inc. is committed to use these Home-Safe-Home services to enhance the well-being of the community we serve. We look forward to tracking these services during the next fiscal year and will look for trends and opportunities to enhance this program, with our focus on outstanding community education. This is another service we provide to help fulfill our mission statement.

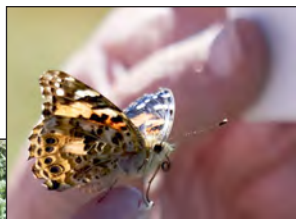
8TH Annual Butterfly Release

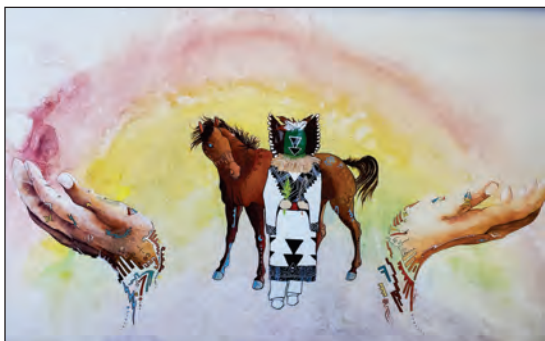


4th Annual Art for Hospice

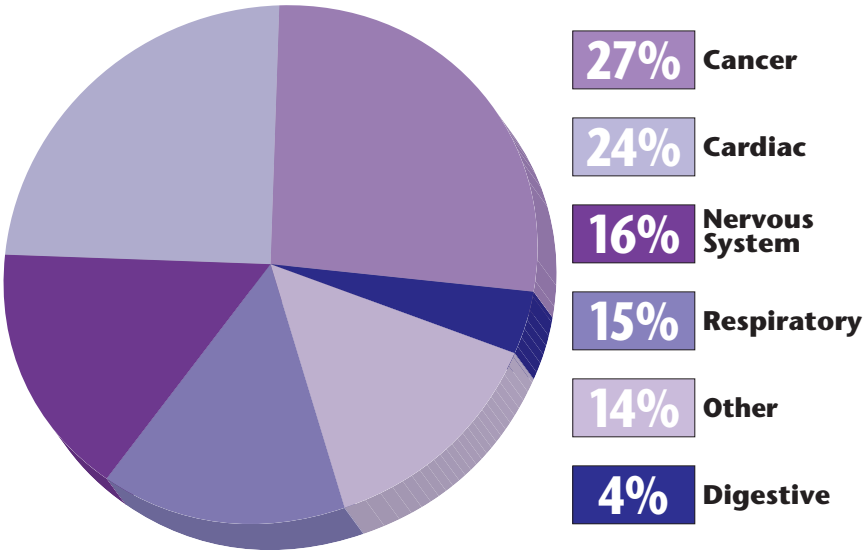

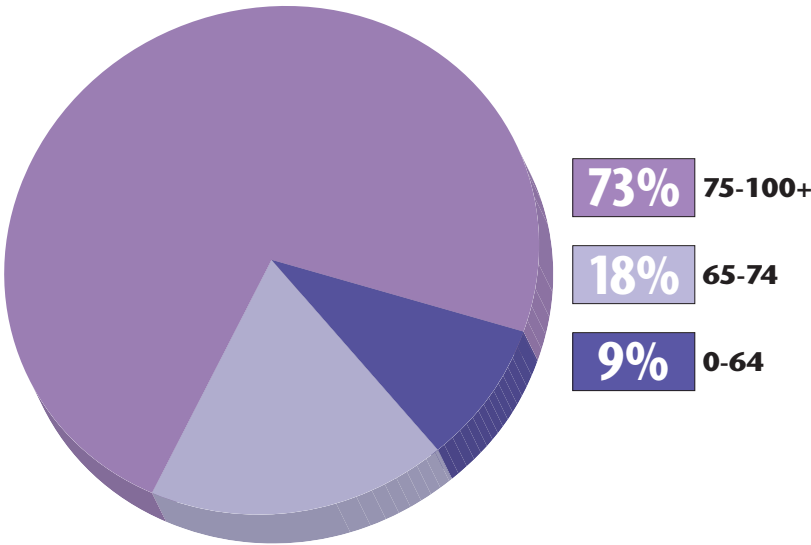

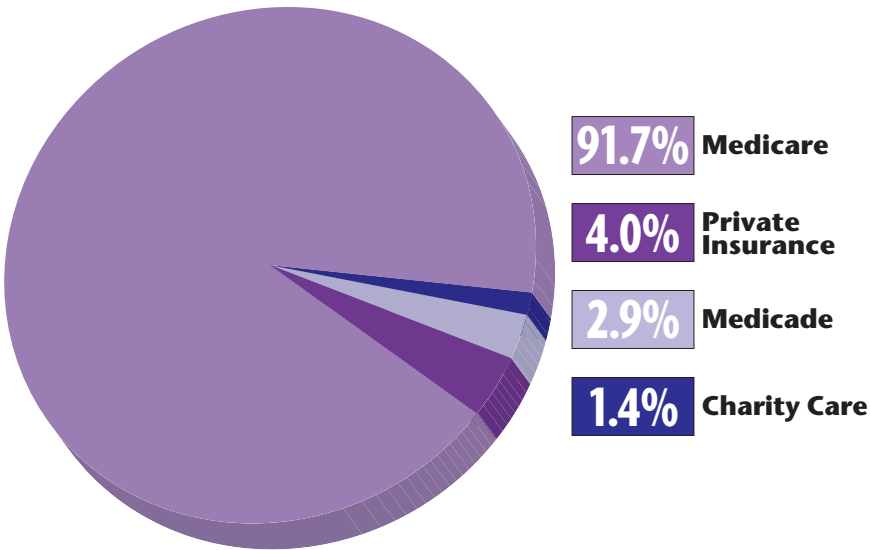
Patients by **Diagnoses**



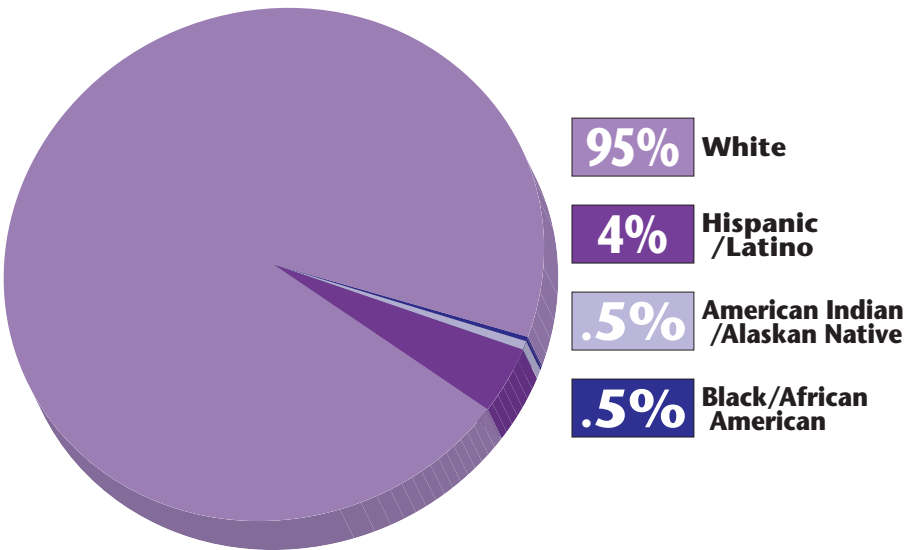
Patients by **Age**



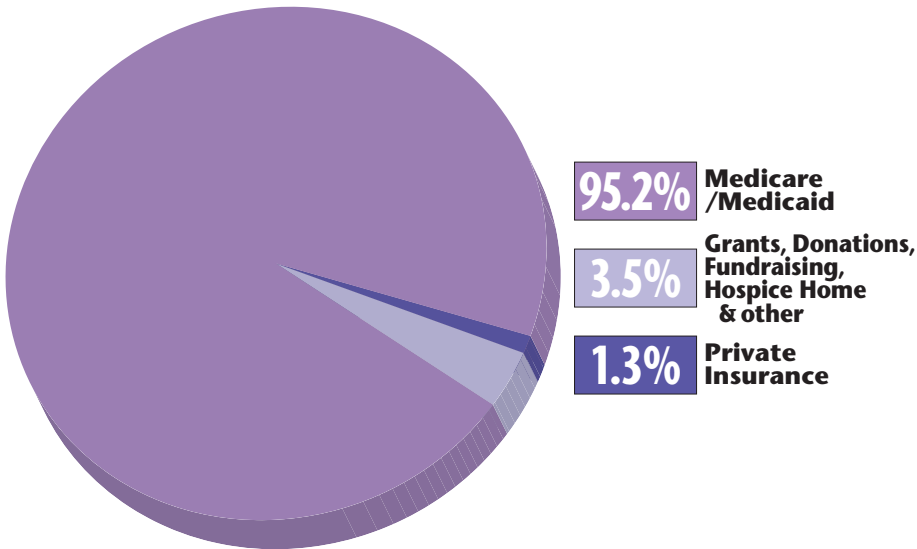
Patients by **Funding**



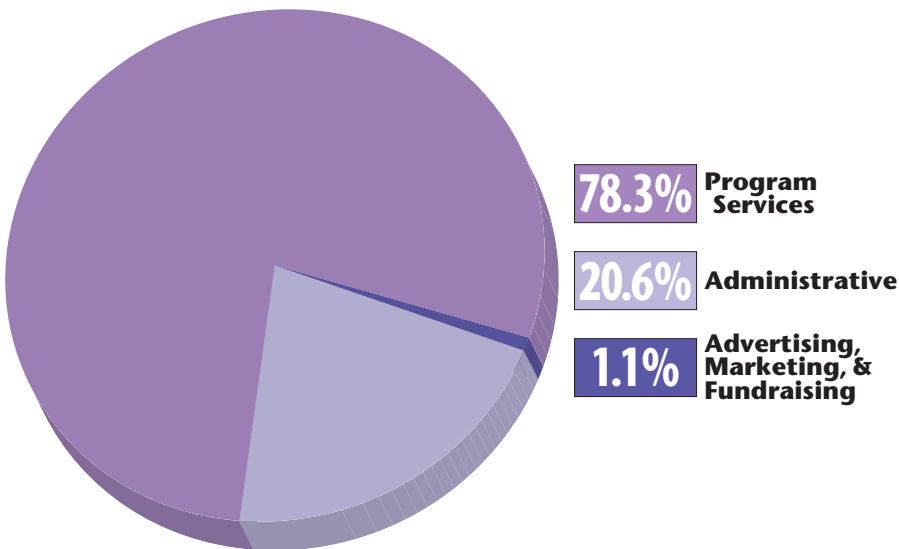
Patients by **Ethnicity**
